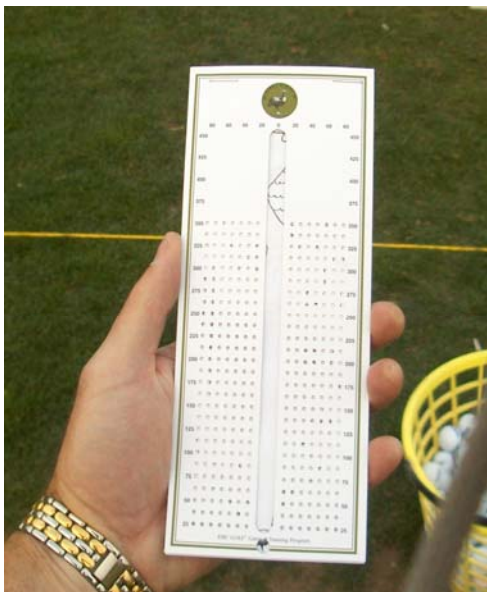




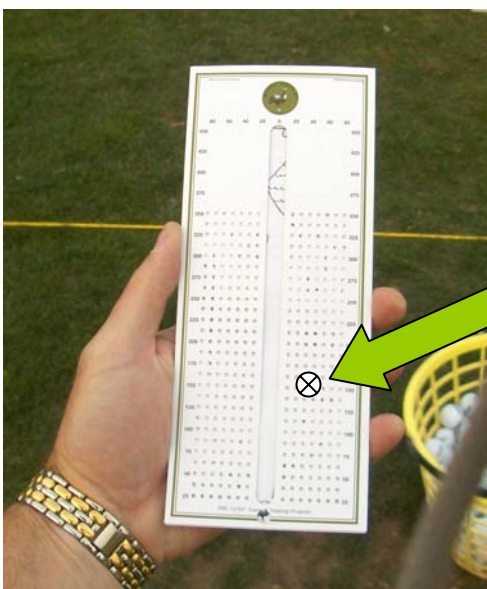
How to use the EMU GOLF scorecard booklet



- Stand in the Tee Box.
- Look toward the fairway.
- Identify the vertical distance markers.
- Identify the horizontal distance markers -- black stakes perpendicular to the vertical markers at 10 yard intervals.
- The distances on the fairway match the distances on the card cover.



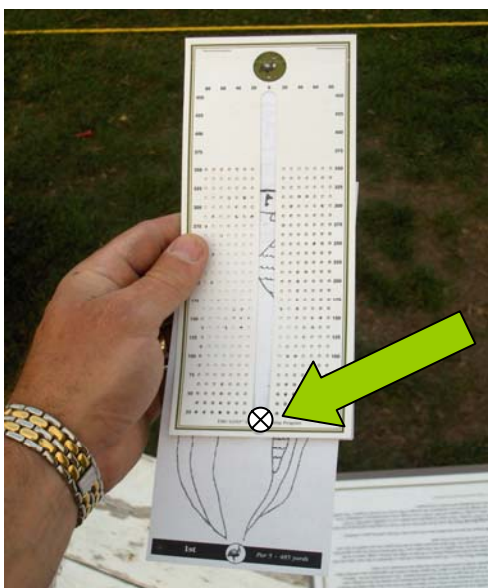
- Flip the cover to show Hole 1.
- Review the hole to determine the playing strategy.
- Select a club for Tee shot.
- Close the cover and place booklet on the bench.



- Take the first shot.
- Determine the vertical and horizontal point of carry and where the ball rests.
- “Declare” the shot (Example: “Carry 240 yards. Stop 260 x 20 to the right.”)
- Mark the distances with a pencil through the cover onto Hole 1.



- Flip the cover to show where the ball is lying.
- The card will identify if the ball is lying on the fairway, in the rough, bunker, hazard or O.B. For O.B., mark a drop position on the card.
- Determine the target line and club for your second shot.



- Tear out the Hole 1 sheet and pull it down until the ball mark appears through the hole at the bottom of the cover.
- Adjust the sheet to create a target line for your second shot.
- Use a clip to keep the sheet in place.
- Lay the booklet on the bench.
- Take your second shot.
- Repeat this process until you are within 30 yards of the pin. Leave your booklet on the bench then turn around to face the green.



- Drop your next shot at the approximate distance from one of the three pins on the green. Use a different pin for each hole played.
- Yardage is measured using the marking stakes around the green or by counting paces from the pin.
- After holing out, return to the tee box and complete your scorecard.
- Remove Hole 1 sheet and slide it into the back of the booklet. Commence playing Hole two.
